



## 2023 School Performance Information

The following information is compiled and published in accordance with the requirements of the *Australian Education Act 2013*.

Whilst the data below is useful it is only one way to obtain information about Tranby and to make judgements about how effectively we educate our students.

In addition, the annual magazine, The Tranby Times, provides a printed and photographic record of the life of the College over the year.

### **a. Contextual information about the school, including characteristics of the student body**

Tranby College is situated in Settlers Hills Estate in the suburb of Baldivis in the City of Rockingham which is located approximately 50 km south of Perth. Students are drawn from Baldivis and surrounding areas between Mandurah, Jarrahdale and Kwinana. The CTC of the College is 107 and in 2023 the ICSEA was 1069 (Australian average 1000).

### **The Mission of Tranby College**

Tranby College is a progressive independent KG - Year 12 Uniting Church school, offering a personalised learning experience that develops self-directed and motivated learners.

Tranby College enrolls students from Kindergarten to Year 12. In 2023 there were approximately 828 students, 49.63% of whom were girls, 50.24% boys, 1 student enrolled as unspecified, 0.6% of students identified indigenous and 8.9% had a language background other than English.

The College received some level of disability funding for 197 students.

**b. Teacher standards and qualifications**

In 2023 all teaching staff were registered as qualified teachers by the Teachers Registration Board of Western Australia (TRBWA).

**c. Workforce composition**

100.76 FTE staff worked at Tranby in 2023 with teachers making up 66.7% of the total workforce.

**d. Student attendance**

i) Percentage rates of attendance in each year level for 2023, i.e. actual student days as a percentage of possible student days:

ii) Attendance is managed through SEQTA, online systems linked to TASS & MAZE data bases and is accessed by all teachers at the start of the day and at the start of every lesson to record attendance. Absences are coded according to their cause. Parents are asked to ring in the morning to notify the school if their child is away and are asked to confirm this with a note on their return. Parents are contacted if an absence is unexplained - firstly by SMS and then by phone or email if an explanation is not provided.

**e. Senior Secondary Outcomes**

Tranby students performed well with 50% of ATAR students in the top 27% of the population, with 61% in the top 30% of the population. One student achieved in the top 1.95% of the state, and 8 students in the top 10% of the state.

### Vocational Education and Training:

Students obtained certificates in Auto Vocational: Light Heavy Electrical, Building and Construction, Business, Community Services, Early Childhood Education and Care, Electrotechnology, Electronics, Health Services Assistant, Hospitality, Engineering, Plumbing, Retail Cosmetics, Screen & Media, Sport & Recreation, Visual Arts and Workplace Skills. The courses were undertaken both on and off-site.

A total of 56 Certificate II and 4 Certificate III were achieved during the course of the year.

#### f. **Post-school destinations**

34 students applied for university entrance and 25 were offered their first preference. Students took up places in Curtin University, Murdoch University and The University of Western Australia. However, due to the early offer processes for 2023, the available data from TISC is incomplete. Additionally, 8 students achieved a nominal ATAR of 70 through completing Tranby's Curtin University UniReady in school's pathway.

Of the remaining students, some enrolled in TAFE or commenced apprenticeships.

#### **h. Parent satisfaction with the school**

Parents have several avenues to express their satisfaction with the College. The Senior Leadership Team actively engages with all stakeholders, welcoming opportunities for communication and feedback. The relationship between parents and the College continues to strengthen, with ongoing communication between the College, teachers, and parents remaining a primary focus for continuous improvement.

The Principal has engaged with a series of formal and information parent sessions, where parents can provide feedback and ask questions directly to the Principal. These sessions have been well attended and will continue to be scheduled for the remainder of 2024 into 2025.

At the end of 2023, the College sought feedback from the College community via an anonymous feedback mechanism through a 'We Listen' survey. This provided information in relation to a number of matters including co-curricular offerings, class sizes and potential future opportunities for the College to further investigate. This provided exceptionally useful information as to how best to further progress the College and provided excellent positive feedback to be able to pass on to College staff.
